AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A POLICY AUTHORIZING ALTERNATE AUTHORIZED SIGNATORIES TO CONDUCT OSWEGO TOWNSHIP BUSINESS IN THE ABSENCE OF THE TOWNSHIP SUPERVISOR AND TOWNSHIP CLERK

WHEREAS, the Township Supervisor of Oswego Township ("Township") has express authority as permitted by Section 1/70-15(b) of the Illinois Township Code (the "Code") to receive and payout all moneys raised in the township for defraying township charges; and

WHEREAS, when the Township Supervisor issues a payout for funds from the township treasury, the Code requires the Township Clerk to attest to such payments pursuant to Section 1/7-27 under Public Act 100-983; and

WHEREAS, the Township's current practice requires all bills, invoices, and related documents representing the Township's indebtedness and charges to be signed by the Township Supervisor and countersigned by the Township Clerk for payout; and

WHEREAS, under certain circumstances either the Township Supervisor or the Township Clerk may be out of town or temporarily unavailable to provide signatures for payout for funds from the Township treasury; and

WHEREAS, the Township Board deems it fiscally responsible and in the best interests of the Township and its residents to delegate signatory authority to certain alternate Township officers and the Deputy Clerk in accordance with the township Board Policy set forth in Exhibit A to this Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Board that there is hereby adopted the following Ordinance establishing a policy authorizing township officers and the deputy clerk to serve as alternate authorized signatories is adopted as follows:

SECTION ONE: The Signatory Authority for Alternate Township Officers Policy as set forth in Exhibit A attached to this Ordinance, is hereby adopted.

SECTION TWO: The signatory authority of the township officers and the Deputy Clerk under this Ordinance shall be limited to the circumstances outlined by the Board Policy in Exhibit A, and shall in no way diminish or impair the authority of the Township Supervisor or the Township Clerk in execution of their duties pursuant to the Code.

SECTION THREE: If any section, subdivision or sentence of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held invalid, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

SECTION FOUR: That this Ordinance shall take precedence over any ordinance, resolution, or motion that may be in conflict with its provisions, and such ordinance, resolutions, or motion is hereby repealed to the extent that it conflicts.

SECTION FIVE: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage by the Oswego Township Board.

EXHIBIT A

SIGNATORY AUTHORITY FOR ALTERNATE TOWNSHIP OFFICERS POLICY FOR OSWEGO TOWNSHIP, KENDALL COUNTY, ILLINOIS

SECTION ONE: Definitions

- A. "Officer" means a person who holds, by election or appointment, an office listed under Section 1/55-10 of the Township Code (the "Code") in the Oswego Township, regardless of whether the officer is compensated for service in his or her official capacity.
- B. "Deputy Clerk" means a person who holds an as appointed by the Township Clerk, when authorized by the Township Board, pursuant to Section 1/75-45 of the Code.

SECTION TWO: Township Supervisor Alternate Authorized Signatories

- A. The following officers are hereby empowered to act, in this order, as authorized signatories to sign documents and warrants when the Township Supervisor is unavailable:
 - 1. Township Assessor
 - 2. Township Highway Commissioner
- B. The aforementioned alternate authorized signatories may exercise their signatory authority to issue a payout of funds from the Township treasury pursuant to Sections 1/70-15(b) and 1/7-27 of the Code upon a determination that the Township Supervisor is unavailable to provide a signature as Chief Executive Officer.

SECTION THREE: Township Clerk Alternate Authorized Signatory

- A. The Deputy Clerk is hereby empowered to sign documents and warrants as an authorized signatory when the Township Clerk is unavailable.
- B. The Deputy Clerk may exercise his or her signatory authority to countersign the Township Supervisor or alternate authorized signatory pursuant to Sections 1/75-45 and 1/7-27 of the Code upon a determination that the Township Supervisor is unavailable to provide his or her signature as Township Clerk.
